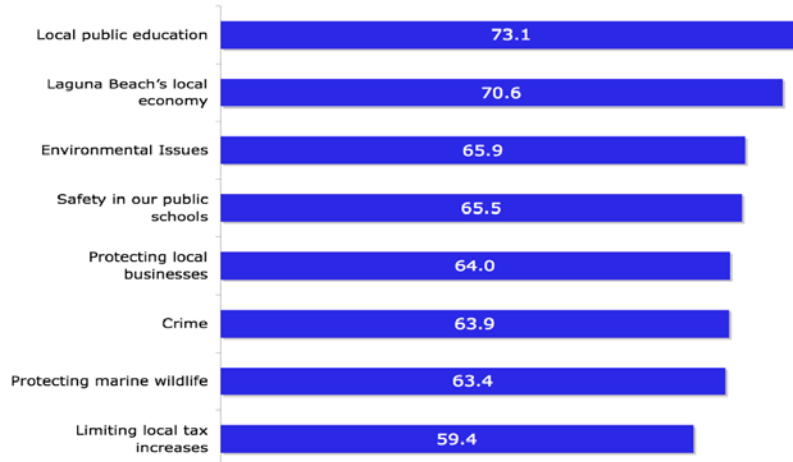


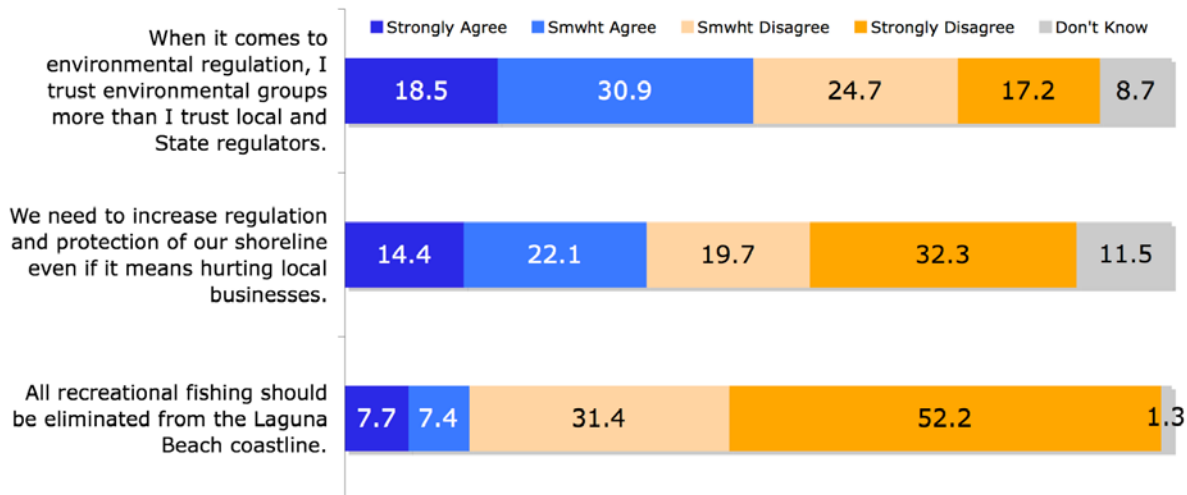
LAGUNA BEACH SURVEY RESULTS

Laguna Beach voters rank environmental issues high, but reject the expansion of the State Marine Reserve along the Laguna Beach shoreline if it means the elimination of recreational fishing or putting local businesses at risk.

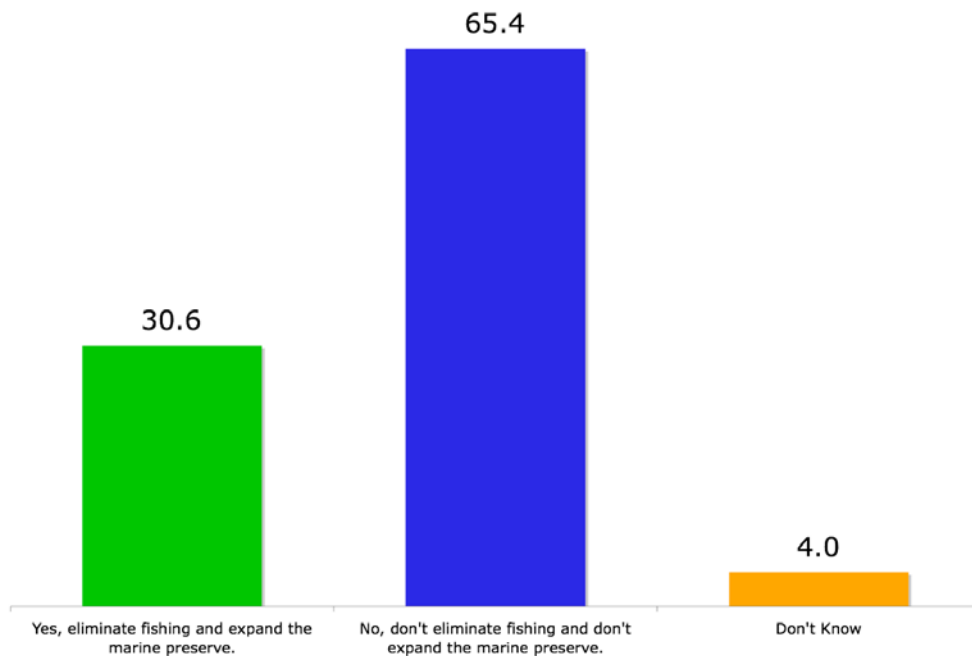
When asked about the importance of specific issues, Laguna Beach voters rank public education, the local economy, and the environment high.



Laguna Beach voters are supportive of environmental causes, but reject initiatives that would hurt local businesses and the Laguna Beach economy, and they refuse to sacrifice recreational fishing along their coastline.



When asked about the proposal to expand the state marine reserve along the Laguna Beach shoreline and eliminate recreational fishing from the waters off Laguna Beach's shoreline, voters rejected the proposal by more than 2 to 1.



This survey was conducted by California-based Research Analytics & Strategy between November 3-4, 2009 among active Laguna Beach voters. A representative portion of the questions are included here. The survey's margin of error is ±4.9.
